EQUIPMENT LIST

The following is a list of items, which we recommend you bring. Quiet wool cloths are the best cloths for our fall hunts. Wool is quiet, warm and keeps you dry. If you do get soaked to the bone, it still keeps you warm. Hunters wearing quiet cloths in natural colors significantly increase their chance of success. Hunter orange is not required in BC. If you are looking forward to watching your guide call in a bull during the rut, it is critical that you dress properly for this type of hunting. Wool in natural colors are the best. When crossing through customs you should have a passport or birth certificate as well as the yellow copy of our contract. The firearm declaration form must be signed in front of the Customs Officer

Fall Hunt List

- Rifle and sufficient ammunition (.270 or larger)
- A butt stock shell holder is a good way to carry extra ammunition quietly
- Camera
- Warm wool pants
- Warm wool Jacket
- Long underwear, Silk, wool and fleece are the best
- Quiet polar fleece or cotton hunting pants for warm days
- Storm gear. A good quiet water proof shell to go over your wool jacket
- Warm hat or toque
- Good walking and climbing boots
- Pair of camp shoes
- Wool socks and liner socks
- Rubber boots (the kind with a full felt liner are the best)
- Toiletries and gear (soap, towel, etc.)
- Day pack
- Pack with a good sturdy frame
- Binoculars
- 6 extra large game bags
- 2 pairs of warm gloves
- Flashlight. The new L.E.D. lights work excellent and the head lamps allow you to work hands free
- Hunting knife and sharpening tools
- Sleeping Bag and Small pillow
- Fishing gear (rod & reel, spinners, spoons, hooks, etc.)
- Late hunts require your vehicles have quality snow tires

Winter Hunt List

- Rifle and sufficient ammunition
- A butt stock shell holder is a great way to quietly and conveniently carry extra ammunition
- Warm sleeping bag
- Camera
- Warm snow pants
- Warm winter jacket with -40 rating
- Long underwear
- Warm hat, foam face shield and goggles. Exposed skin freezes in seconds when snowmobiling in cold weather.
- Good winter boots with a -40 rating. If your feet get cold you will not have any fun. Proper winter boots have a removable liner and a second insulating pad under that between your foot and the ground. Cold is transferred up through the bottom of your foot.
- Pair of camp shoes or slippers
- Wool socks and liner socks
- Toiletries (soap, towel, toothbrush etc.)
- Pack or duffle bag
- Binoculars
- 2 pairs of warm gloves, they should layer with a big outer and a inner liner
- Flashlight
- Hunting knife
- Small pillow
